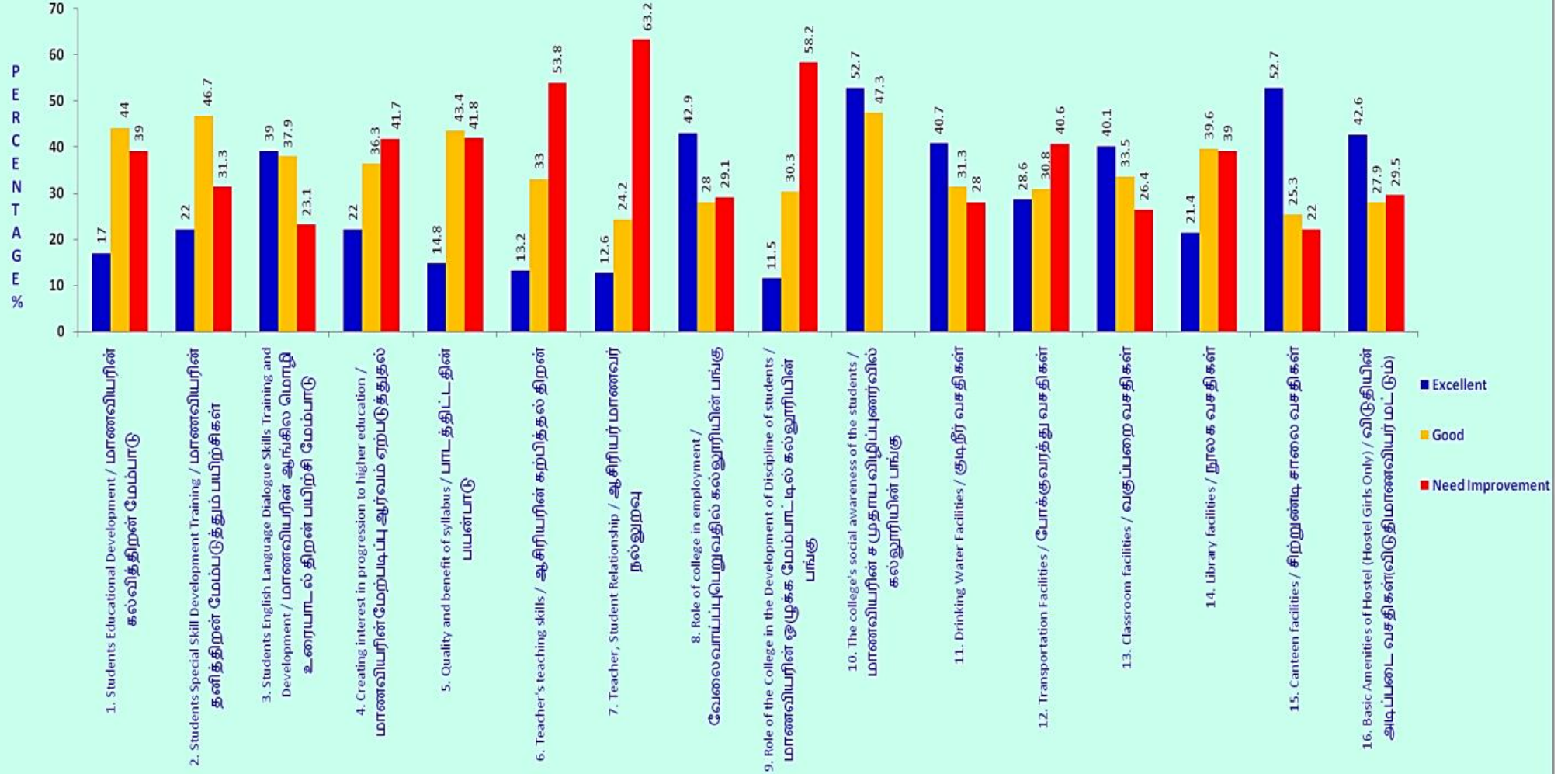
FEEDBACK ANALYSIS 2022-2023

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PARENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT ON CURRICULUM 2022-2023

In an institutional setting, gathering feedback from parents will enhance both the educational experience and the overall development of the institution. An in-depth analysis of the online Parents' Feedback Survey was conducted for the academic year 2022-2023 using Google Forms, available at <https://forms.gle/oPyuziWJjbmHDQJk8>. This report details the analysis of responses across various categories and presents recommendations and actions taken to achieve academic excellence.

1. Students' Educational Development

Analysis: A total of 44% of parents rated the college's role in their children's educational development as "Good," while 17% rated it as "Excellent." However, 39% of parents indicated that this area requires improvement.

2. Special Skill Development Training

Analysis: 46.7% of parents rated the college's special skill development programs as "Good," while 22% rated them "Excellent." However, 31.3% suggested there is room for improvement.

3. English Language Dialogue Skills Training

Analysis: English language training received positive feedback, with 39% rating it "Excellent" and 37.9% rating it "Good." However, 23.1% indicated the need for further improvement.

4. Progression to Higher Education

Analysis: While 22% of parents rated the college's efforts in encouraging higher education as "Excellent," 41.7% felt this area needs improvement.

5. Quality and Benefits of the Syllabus

Analysis: While 43.4% of parents rated the syllabus quality as "Good," 41.8% believed it could be improved.

6. Teachers' Teaching Skills

Analysis: Teaching skills were identified as an area needing improvement, with 53.8% of parents indicating that there is room for growth, though 33% rated the teaching as “Good.”

7. Teacher-Student Relationship

Analysis: A majority (63.2%) of parents expressed that the teacher-student relationship needs improvement.

8. Role of the College in Employment

Analysis: 42.9% of parents rated the college’s role in employment opportunities as “Excellent,” though 29.1% felt there was room for improvement.

9. Development of Discipline

Analysis: While 30.3% rated the college’s role in instilling discipline as “Good,” 58.2% of parents indicated the need for improvement.

10. Social Awareness Initiatives

Analysis: Social awareness programs were well-received, with 52.7% of parents rating them as “Excellent.”

11. Drinking Water Facilities

Analysis: Drinking water facilities were rated as “Good” by 31.3% of parents, but 28% expressed the need for improvement.

12. Transportation Facilities

Analysis: Transportation services were rated as needing improvement by 40.6% of parents.

13. Classroom Facilities

Analysis: While 40.1% of parents rated classroom facilities as “Excellent,” 26.4% suggested the need for improvement.

14. Library Facilities

Analysis: 39% of parents felt the library facilities needed improvement, though 39.6% rated them as “Good.”

15. Canteen Facilities

Analysis: Canteen facilities were rated “Excellent” by 52.7% of parents, but 22% indicated some areas for improvement.

16. Hostel Basic Amenities

Analysis: 42.6% of parents rated hostel amenities as “Excellent,” but 29.5% felt improvements were needed.
